A Champion for the Healing Courtyards

Even after retiring from a long career as CEO of Driscoll's, Ken Morena has been anything but idle. He still serves as a mentor for the company's staff and has become one of the champions of Dominican Hospital's Healing Courtyards Initiative.

His involvement with the project began soon after his wife, Velma, spent some time in the hospital as a patient. Although Morena thought the services and treatment Dominican's staff provided were superlative, he felt the environment could be improved.

"That's what really got me involved," says Morena. "We wanted to make it better than we found it. The treatment was great, and the nurses and doctors were terrific, but the hospital itself was lacking in personality."

Soon after helping to plan the project, Morena found himself in a role he had never held—as a fundraiser. He was slightly reluctant to ask his friends and colleagues for donations, but after discovering how many of them relied on the hospital's services, he successfully convinced them of the importance of giving back and raised a substantial amount for Dominican.

"We look at it as our hospital, and if I'm sick or injured, or if my wife becomes sick again, that's where we're going to be," says Morena. "And if we can make it better, that's what we're going to do."

Taking a role in a project that will benefit thousands of people in Santa Cruz County is the most rewarding aspect of donating his time and energy to Dominican Hospital, and Morena plans to continue to give back as much as he can.

"It's a feel-good thing," he says. "Doing something that will benefit so many, including myself and my own family, has made it very satisfying."



Phase II of the Healing Courtyards Gets a Boost

Ever since she was recruited by one of the Sisters of Dominican Hospital decades ago, Pam Santacroce has been an integral part of the hospital's evolution, serving as a member of the Dominican Hospital Board. What has drawn her to the hospital—both then and now—is its focus on what is most important.

"In speaking of the hospital, its roots are in charity and goodness, and its focus is on caring for the patients. But it's also always willing to move forward to make the latest technology available," says Pam Santacroce.

Santacroce's late husband, Nello, was there to support her through all the roles she served at the hospital and in their property management business. Like Dominican Hospital, Nello was never afraid to take the next step forward, to stay current with the times, and look toward the cutting edge.

"It has been an adventure to have lived with Nello and to have leapt forward with Dominican Hospital," says Santacroce. "They have both been an inspiration to me."

To honor Nello and give back to the hospital, which they both loved, Santacroce made a substantial donation to Dominican's Healing Courtyards Initiative. Because they lived by the ocean for many years, Santacroce thought it fitting to have the wall of water named in honor of Nello. The water wall will provide the hospital's patients and staff with a sense of peace and serve as a symbol of the hospital's focus on what matters most.

"All hospitals are shining stars," says Santacroce, "but Dominican Hospital truly has a heart."

The Healing Courtyards Initiative launched with a great start and has just kept going. Of the \$3 million needed for Phase I, \$2.4 million has already been committed. Phase I funds create a much needed surgery lounge (a naming opportunity is still available), a courtyard and terrace, and a rehabilitation garden. And already, \$250,000 has come in for Phase II, which includes the family and newborn care courtyard and meditation garden, plus the front entry. According to Joe Burton, the Healing Courtyards Initiative committee chair, "Plans include breaking ground shortly, with some grand openings during the hospital's 75th Anniversary year."
