



Pteron Society

Six years ago, a group of physicians came together to establish the Pteron Society, an annual giving club for physicians that funds scholarships to encourage high school students interested in a career in a medical field. The 6th Annual Pteron Scholarship Award Reception was held on May 30, 2013 in the Education Building at Dominican Hospital. Fifteen seniors headed for careers in the medical field were awarded \$500 each.

The celebration also included recognition of students completing the Health Career Academy, a partnership of Cabrillo College and Dominican Hospital, funded by a grant from the California Endowment. The program is designed to broaden students' awareness of health careers by exposing them to hands-on experiences at the hospital. Ten students received \$3,000 scholarships to participate in the Academy, which began with a course covering professional demeanor in the workplace, ethics, and leadership as it applies to healthcare. The second part of the program

had students rotate between the hospital and the RotaCare Clinic, a free clinic held on Tuesday nights in Live Oak. At the hospital, students were assigned to individual mentors in the Acute Rehabilitation Unit and Center for Lifestyle Management.

"The Academy was an eye opening experience," says Diana Majors, a Cabrillo student who rotated at the Acute Rehabilitation Unit. "It was amazing to connect what we learned about stroke in class to real life while observing patients. It is a miracle to see the effects of various therapies and witness the improvements patients make in just one week." Diana is seriously considering pursuing a career as an Occupational Therapist.

The reception provided the students from both groups an opportunity to mix and mingle, discussing their experiences.

Rigoberto applied and was accepted to Brown, Cornell, and UCLA. He will attend Cornell in the fall.



Grateful Patients Honor Doctors



Employee Giving Campaign

Dominican Hospital employees have donated more than \$750,000 to the Foundation since the inception of the Employee Giving Campaign in 1995. This campaign is special because it demonstrates a commitment to Dominican's cause by those closest to the hospital, and sends a significant message to philanthropists, foundations, and corporations, helping to leverage grant funding and major gifts.

"I give to Dominican because of very personal reasons," says John Hadveck from the Engineering Department. On July 14, 2004, John's daughter Robin was born at Dominican Hospital. She was struggling for breath from what turned out to be Aspiration Pneumonia, inflammation of the lungs and the airways, a potentially fatal condition for an infant. A nurse noticed that something was amiss right away and transferred baby Robin to an oxygen tent in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. John's gift of \$1,000, to this year's campaign honored Kathy Woodruff, the nurse that saved his daughters life. "She is my heroine," says John. Kathy has retired from Dominican but her memory lives on in our Maternal Child Health Department.

This year's campaign was held in May and focused on the Acute Rehabilitation Unit. Employees can also designate their gift to an area that they care about. Currently over 250 employees are active donors to the Foundation.
