Dear Community Members,





1941

Sisters Hospital & The First Donations

The Adrian Dominican Sisters came to Santa Cruz from Michigan to take over the abandoned Hanly Hospital on West Cliff and renamed it, Sisters Hospital. When funds were short, they went to the wharf with a cigar box to appeal to local fishermen.



1966

Dominican Hospital

Responding to the thriving populace, the Sisters bought 17 acres on the edge of town. The Dominican Hospital Founders Club, (now known as the Dominican Hospital Foundation), raised \$1 million for the new Hospital on Soquel Drive.



1977

Dominican Hospital Foundation

The Foundation was incorporated to support the Hospital through philanthropic contributions from the community. Bob Swenson was the founding President of the board with Al Castagnola as the Executive Director.

• 1979

Brain Scanner

Thanks to the Foundation's help, neurological services have greatly advanced since the purchase of the first brain scanner.

• 1979

Heritage Club

The Foundation Board established the Heritage Club, a way to encourage and acknowledge bequests and other planned gifts. The Club is now known as the Bob Swenson Legacy Society in honor of the Foundation's first president and has over 105 members.

1980

Personal Enrichment Program is Launched, Supported by Private Donations

As a thriving education program, PEP offers a wide variety of health, wellness, and rehabilitation classes. Last year over 500 classes were attended by 3,418 students; scholarships are provided thanks to our donors.

Patient Financial Assistance Fund Created by Foundation

The Fund was created, and continues, to provide assistance to uninsured and underinsured patients.

Dominican Oaks

Dominican Oaks is a gracious, retirement facility housing 230 seniors. Dominican Oaks Community Enrichment Fund started with a generous gift to the Foundation and is today supplemented by donations from staff and residents.

• 1987

The First Holidays d’Eleganz Gala

The Guild founded the Holidays d’Eleganz with co-chairs Maureen Benito and Angel Goscilla. This annual extravaganza has raised over \$4 million for patient care.



1993

Emergency Room Remodel & Expansion

Foundation leadership raised \$1 million for the new 11,870 sq ft facility. Special features included: private rooms, acute section for life threatening injuries or illnesses, and designated areas for orthopedics, trauma, obstetrics, pediatrics, and mental health patients.



1996

Pediatric Clinic

Largely funded by the Foundation, this clinic's focus was directed care for underserved and underinsured children, many with significant medical problems. This has since been transitioned to the Live Oak Family Center, doubling in capacity and serving over 3,000 children. It is still partially supported by Dominican Hospital and the Foundation.

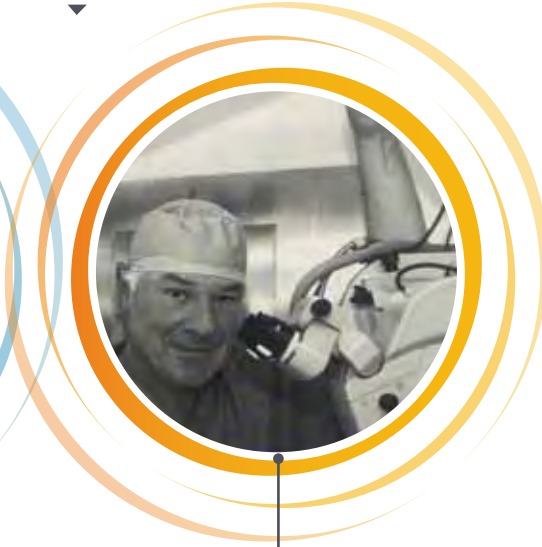


1998

Calciano Symposium

The Jon E. Nadherny/Calciano Memorial Youth Symposium was founded in 1997 by the Nadherny/Calciano family as a way of dealing with the tragic loss of their son Jon to suicide. It has evolved into a world-class, annual symposium, produced by Dominican Hospital and the Symposium committee, addressing key topics on adolescent mental health. An Endowment was established at the Foundation to help fund the program.

Neurosurgeon Dr. Gail Magid brought neurosurgery to Santa Cruz in the 1960's and shared his pioneering spirit and expertise with the Foundation as a board member.



2000

Microscope and 3-D Imaging technology for Neurosurgery

With help from the Foundation, Dominican has become among the first on the West Coast to offer the most innovative technology for neurosurgery, with a new operating microscope and 3-D computer imaging technology.

Suzy and Bennett Katz made a generous donation to help open the center. ▼

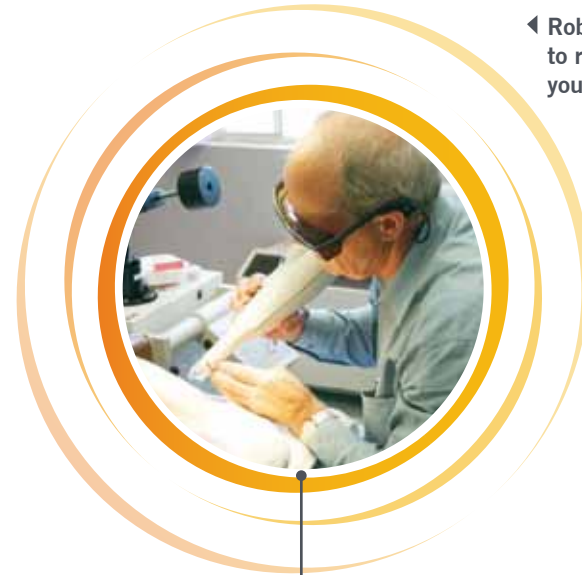

2000

Bennett & Suzy Katz Cancer Resource Center Opens

Launched by Dr. Steven Plager with a significant gift from Bennet and Suzy Katz and numerous community donations, the Katz Cancer Resource Center serves those affected by cancer with personalized programs, education, and support groups. On staff are two oncology nurse navigators, one of whom is Spanish-speaking. They answer questions, assist with medical care coordination, and direct patients to an array of community resources. All services are free of charge.

2000

Tattoo Removal Clinic

The Dominican Hospital Foundation funded the Tattoo Removal Clinic for more than 15 years and continues to support it through a new partnership with Catholic Charities. The clinic reaches out to gang members and others whose tattoos interfere with a mainstream lifestyle. Currently, nine physicians donate their time. Recently the Foundation provided \$25,000 for purchase of a new laser, thanks to the leadership of Dr. Gail Magid.



2004

Wheeler Organic Garden

The late Joanne Marie Wheeler was a generous benefactor of Dominican Hospital and an avid gardener. To recognize Joanne and her late husband Harrison's philanthropy, the organic vegetable garden was named in their honor. The garden contains numerous varieties of fruits and vegetables. The 2,000-3,000 pounds harvested, annually, is used either at Dominican Oaks or the hospital cafeteria.

• 2006

Technology Advances

Foundation donations allowed for the technological upgrades for the weather station for helicopter operations, electronic patient charting system, and a computerized radiology reader.



2008

Da Vinci Surgical Robot

This \$1.5 million robot was purchased, thanks to a generous bequest to the Foundation from the Wheeler Family. With the da Vinci Robotic Surgical System, patients experience the benefits of less invasive surgery. These include faster recovery, lower blood loss, less pain after surgery, and improved outcomes.



It has allowed us to operate in a minimally invasive way on patients who otherwise would need a large open incision. I see better because of 3-D magnification and a high-definition screen. I use the da Vinci for about 70 % of the surgeries I do in any given month, and of the major surgeries I do, it is nearly 100% da Vinci," says Anne-Marie Jackson, MD, a gynecologist with Dignity Health Medical Group.

**Leica
Microscope**

With the Foundation's continued support of neurosurgery, the purchase of the Leica Microscope provides high quality optics and engineering as a multidisciplinary tool for cranial and spinal microsurgeries.

**Medical Library Endowment
Founded In Honor of
Dr. Joseph Anzalone**

Dr. Anzalone delivered nearly 14,000 babies since he started his practice focused on obstetrics in Santa Cruz in 1964. He was instrumental in the construction of an obstetrical operating room at Dominican and was a champion for the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, opened in 1979. He was devoted to his patients, his community, and to Dominican Hospital.



2011

Transport Isolette - A "Mini NICU on Wheels"

Dominican is the only facility providing life support for infants in Santa Cruz County and the Foundation has been a proud supporter of our smallest patients. This state-of-the-art Transport Isolette travels tri-county wide to pick up infants and can provide heat, ventilation, IV fluid, and is outfitted with medical air and oxygen. "The team is ready to go at a moment's notice. Once we get a call, the neonatologist travels ahead of the ambulance to the referring hospital and stabilizes the infant before he or she is transferred," says Dr. Magdy Ismail. "We keep 85% of the babies here who we used to have to transport to Stanford." Donations to the Foundation helped fund the shuttle.



2011

Mobile Wellness Clinic

The Hospital's Mobile Wellness Clinic provides access to quality health care for those in need. The 37-foot RV travels to eight locations in Aptos, Davenport, Felton, Santa Cruz, Scotts Valley, Pajaro, and Watsonville and has been retrofitted with examining rooms and lab, providing treatments, checkups, education, screenings, and referrals. The clinic sees over 2,500 patients/year. "We help patients see a clinician before their condition gets to the point that an ER visit is required," said Sister Michaela Siplak, director of community health integration services at Dominican. Registered nurse Beatriz Walsh recalled, "A man who showed up at the clinic with dangerously high blood sugar levels risked having a stroke or kidney failure, without treatment," she said. "But after his clinic visit, I worked with him to bring his diabetes under control."



Together Campaign

In 2012, the President's Task Force, a community and hospital partnership, convened and identified 6 key initiatives. Over the next four years, the Dominican Hospital Foundation focused on these initiatives successfully completing its \$10 million Together Campaign. Co-chaired by Ted Burke and Linda Burroughs, the Task Force included 72 community leaders.

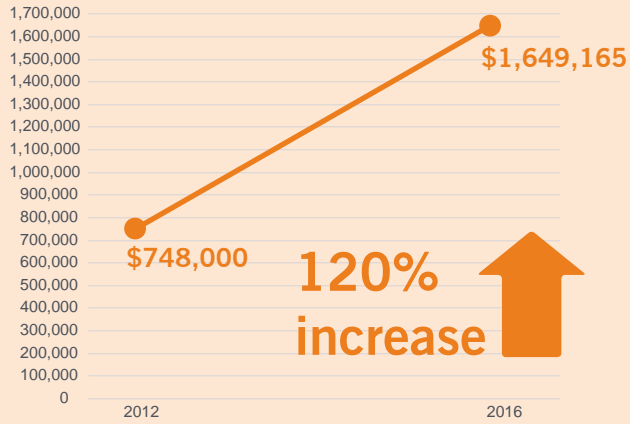

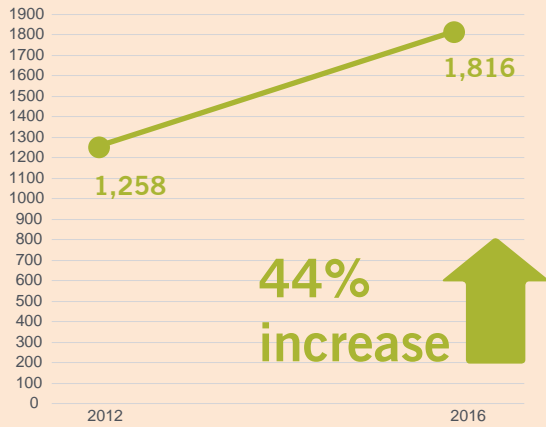
Giving is on the Rise!

Numbers reflect giving in 2012 vs. 2016

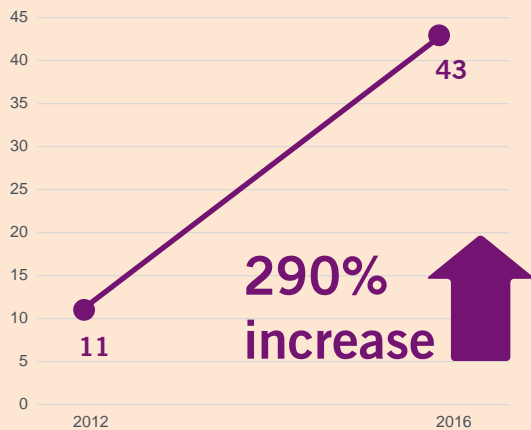
AVERAGE ANNUAL CONTRIBUTIONS (\$)



NUMBER OF DONORS



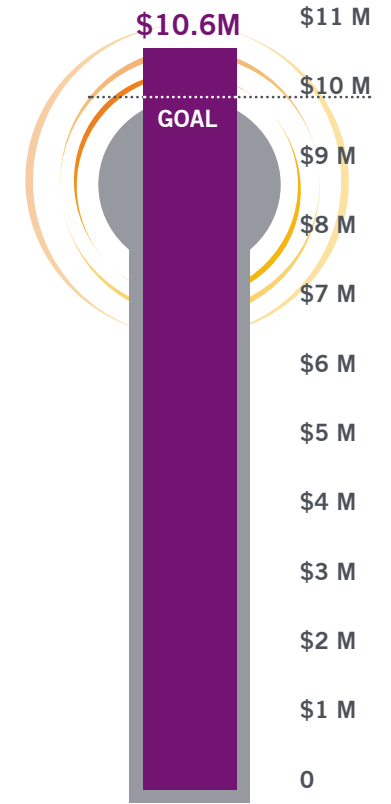
NUMBER OF MAJOR GIFTS



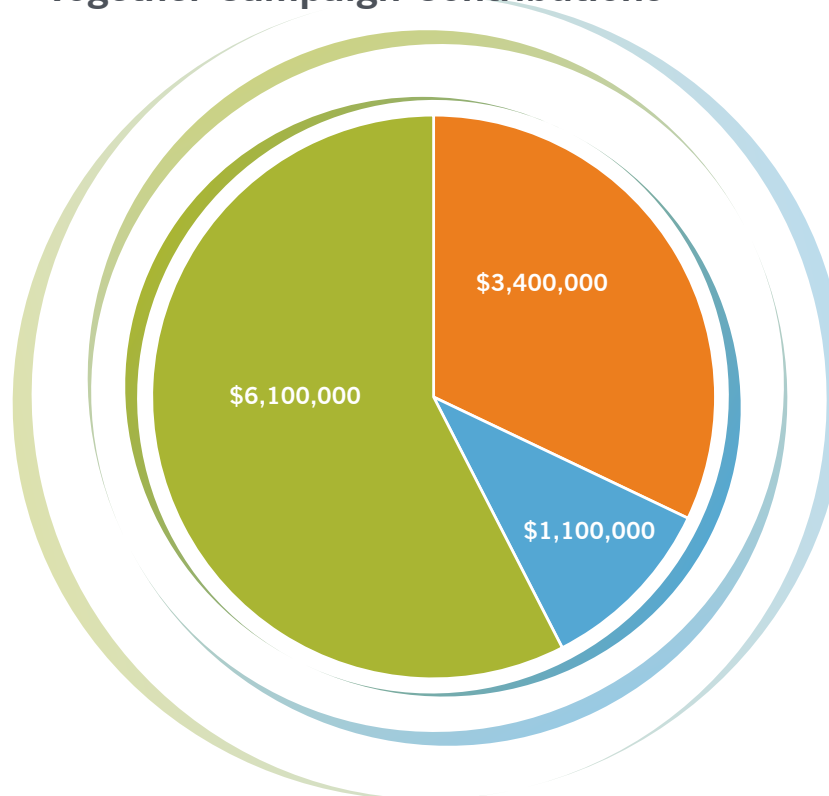

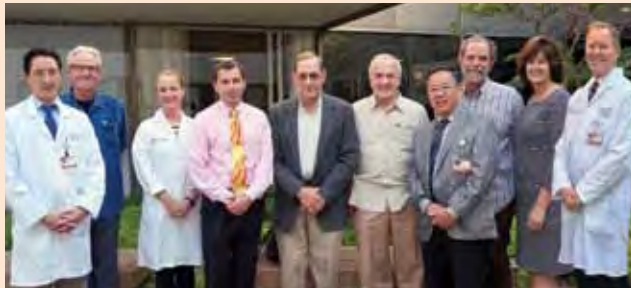

And the impact of Mary's gift that created the Solari Cancer Center continues to grow!

A new Cancer Survivor's Program funded entirely by donations gives cancer survivors a comprehensive, coordinated rehabilitation plan, provided by a team of specially trained physicians, nurses, physical, occupational and speech therapists, dieticians, and mental health professionals. 02: Acute Rehabilitation Unit Key Initiative 2012-2016

Acute Rehabilitation Unit Key Initiative

The completion of the Acute Rehabilitation Unit in April 2013 marked a new milestone for Dominican for care of patients with stroke, brain or spinal injury. The total project cost of \$12 million included \$10 million from Dignity Health and \$2 million from private donations. A lead gift of \$500,000 from the Monterey Peninsula Foundation named the Assisted Daily Living Apartment, where patients can practice the activities of daily living with their families before heading home. Don and Ida Mungai gave a generous \$250,000 gift to name the Dining Room.

O-Arm Imaging System for Neurosurgery

A major investment thanks to private support, the O-arm provides real time 3-D imaging of a patient's anatomy for those undergoing brain, spinal, orthopedic, and trauma related surgeries.

“ The O-arm allows us to know where we are in the body - in real time,” says Ciara Harraher, MD, medical director of neurosurgery at Dominican and clinical assistant professor at Stanford University, Department of Neurosurgery. Neurosurgery.



Vestibular Rehabilitation – Help for Dizziness and Balance

The RealEyes System is a computerized aid for vestibular rehabilitation to help minimize dizziness and balance, funded by the Foundation. This allows the therapist to work with the patient on head and body movements to provoke, reduce, and eliminate their system of dizziness and vertigo.

“ We are the only outpatient neurotherapy provider for vestibular rehab in this region,” says Mary Anne Kramer-Urner, Outpatient Therapy Manager.




Wheelchair Dance

As one of the more innovative donations by the Foundation and organized by Dominican's Acute Rehabilitation Center, the Wheelchair Dance brought together people of all abilities with many in wheelchairs, and others with injuries, cognitive disabilities, or blindness to enjoy the pleasure of dancing.

“ Dancing can improve cognitive function, balance, gait, mood, and motor control,” says Dr. Bonny Masters, a new physiatrist with Dominican who facilitated the workshop.

03: Women and Infant Care Key Initiative 2012-2016

The following are highlights of the many ways that the Foundation supports Women's Health, both prenatal and postpartum care, and Infant Care, specifically in newborn care, as Dominican Hospital is a Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).

Ventilator for Premature Babies

The Foundation provided this latest technology for the smallest pre-term babies who need assistance with breathing.

NICU Retinal Scanner

A new imaging system that helps protect the vision of our smallest patients was the result of generous donations. Nurses use this machine to take screen infants by taking digital video and still pictures of infants' eyes from every angle. "The quality of the pictures is so much better, significantly improving the diagnosis process," said Robin Courtney, a registered nurse in the NICU. The RetCam3 is synched to Lucile Packard Children's Hospital who interprets the images and provides assessment.

Panda Resuscitation & Warming Beds

The Foundation provided six Panda beds for infants. These warming beds have built-in resuscitation equipment and can be easily moved between the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and patient rooms, providing greater safety for our premature babies. The Krassow Family have been longtime supporters of the NICU at Dominican.



Having experienced the loss of our own grandson, we have seen firsthand the devastating impact that serious illness and death of an infant can have on parents, grandparents and extended family members. Our hope is that through our gifts and the generous support of the community we can spare many local families the emotional and physical pain of the loss of an infant,” the Krassows said.

ABUS Breast Ultrasound

This new technology provided by the Foundation, obtains images of the breast in three planes. This ability to view the breast in multiple planes allows the radiologist to accurately and confidently triangulate suspicious lesions for biopsy. With this new ABUS Breast Ultrasound equipment, appointment times are 15 to 30 minutes, versus 60 minutes.

NICU Ultrasound For Pediatric Heart Care

With the new ultrasound, doctors can more rapidly and effectively detect, diagnose, and treat life-threatening heart issues in newborns admitted to the NICU. “The new technology allows us to assess the hearts and vital organs of unborn babies, and helps detect any heart abnormalities before birth. This greatly improves the outcomes for babies with severe heart defects,” says Magdy Ismail, MD, medical director of the Dominican Hospital Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. “This technology is unavailable anywhere else in the county,” Dominican’s NICU Manager Michele Fahrner remarks. “We never want a baby to come to the NICU, but when one has to, we can be confident in saying we offer top-of-the-line, best practice patient care.”

Safely Home – Car Seat Fitting Station

While 96% of parents and caregivers believe their child safety seats are installed correctly, research shows that 70% are not. Motor vehicle injuries are a leading cause of death among children. This program provides all parents with newborns at Dominican, training in car seat installation before they head home plus periodic workshops for the community.

04: Cardiac Key Initiative 2012-2016

Cardiac care is always a high priority of the Foundation. Dominican is the only facility in Santa Cruz County providing emergency heart care. Our heart attack response time has been in the upper 90th percentile nationally for over 5 years.

Echo Cardiograph

The new echo machine provides advanced imaging of the beating heart. It is portable and light and can be easily taken to a patient room. Patients no longer have to be moved to another space for this procedure.

Cardiohelp Machines: Heart And Lung Bypass Machine

An exciting donation by the Foundation, this tool box-sized circulatory system provides short term cardiac and respiratory support for patients with acute pulmonary and cardiac failure. It is only available at three hospitals from Santa Cruz to San Francisco. They can provide life giving emergency support, saving lives.

These blood oxygenation machines are specifically designed to be portable in emergencies outside of the operating room, such as during transportation. The Cardiohelp machine has been instrumental in enabling Drs. Shafi and Sawhney to perform TAVR procedures (Transcatheter aortic valve replacements). Cardiac surgery at Dominican is provided by contract with Palo Alto Medical Foundation.

Dare to Care Cardiovascular Screening Program

Donations provided new ultrasounds and resulted in a new free cardiovascular screening program; one of only six in the country and the only one available on the West Coast. The 15 minute screenings identify common vascular diseases so doctors intervene early with lifestyle interventions and medication instead of invasive surgery. “We know that many older adults have risk factors for vascular disease, and we strongly advocate for screenings that can aid in detection of vascular disease at early stages,” said cardiothoracic surgeon Bilal Shafi, MD, lead physician for Dominican’s Dare to C.A.R.E. program.



The future is exciting. The constant struggle to improve is the challenge and the quest. The result for Dominican Hospital and our community has been a very high quality of cardiac care,” says Dr. Raj Singh, Cardiologist and Medical Director of Cardiology.

Research shows that access to nature can reduce stress levels and the need for pain medication, and shorten the duration of hospital stays.

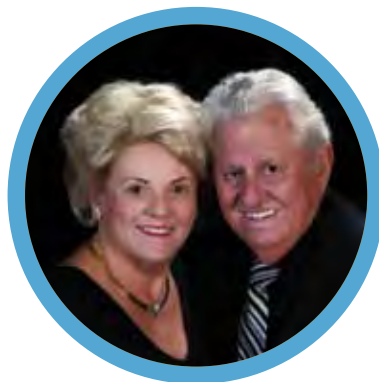

“There will be different heights and surfaces for patients receiving rehabilitation services to negotiate for mobility retraining and safety awareness. Patients can work with their therapists on balance, coordination, endurance, problem solving and social interaction using the proposed putting green, paths and games that will be incorporated into the garden’s design,” says Karen Gosling, Director of Health and Rehabilitation.

The Central Surgery Lounge and Courtyard will be redesigned to include a glass atrium that will open into a garden. New Interventional Endoscopic Services

The new endoscopy suite houses new technology and leading edge equipment, allowing physicians to perform state-of-the-art procedures 24 hours a day. Thanks to more than \$1.4 million in private donations to the Dominican Hospital Foundation, patients now have interventional endoscopic services using the newly purchased endoscopic ultrasound, increasing visualization of the gastrointestinal tract and other organs. The suite also contains in-room anesthesia giving flexibility in procedures such as bronchoscopies—visualization of the lungs, the liver, gall bladder, and pancreas.



Prior to our ability to provide these services, patients would have to be referred to a tertiary care center. This process could take several weeks, while patients and their families had to contend with the anxiety of their potential life-altering diagnosis,” says Dr. Kourosh Ghassemi, Gastroenterologist.

Laboratory Improvements through Recent Donations

Rapid Testing to Aid in Diagnosing Blood Stream Infections



The Verigene test by Nanosphere allows our clinicians to quickly diagnose patients' infections nearly two days earlier than conventional methods," says Eric Van Houten, clinical lab scientist at Dominican.

"Given the time-sensitive nature of this disease, delivery of this clinically actionable information is critical, as it allows faster detection, helping physicians make treatment decisions much more quickly," according to Andre Ramirez, Laboratory Director.

The Joint Care Reunions bring patients together, part of the program’s intent to provide individualized and comprehensive care before, during and after surgery. “There are many different components to this program, for example, a physical therapy session on the same day as the surgery and a nurse navigator that is assigned to every patient,” says Cathy Lawhorne, Orthopedic Nurse Navigator. “This allowed us to have exemplary results such as – over 90% of our patients walking with a therapist on the day after surgery.”

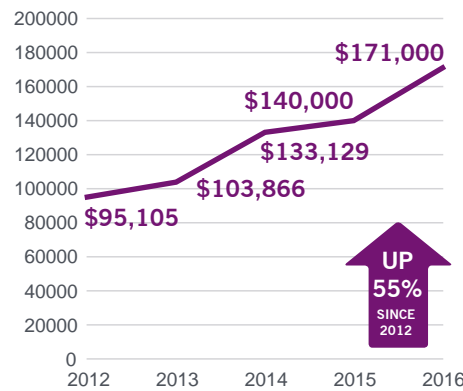

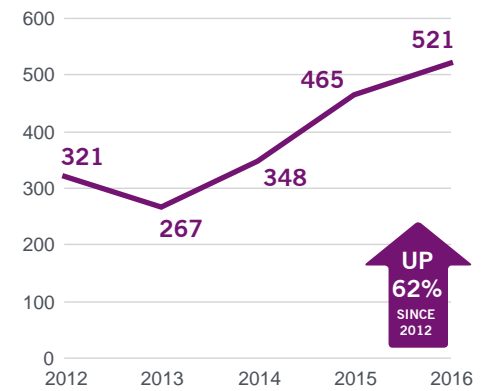

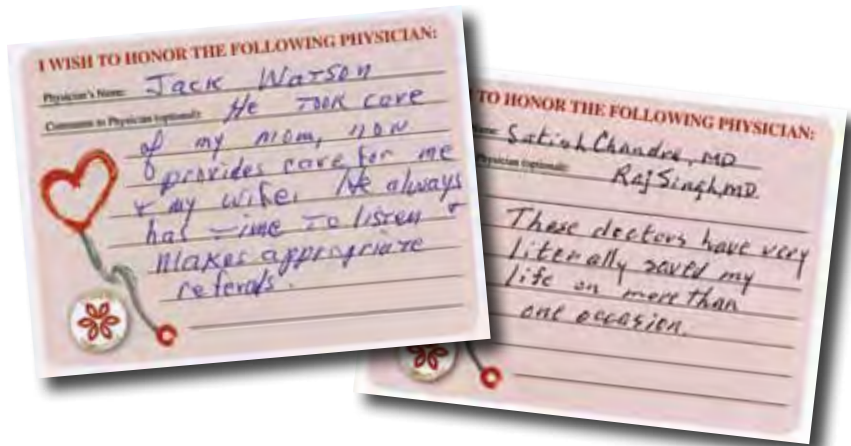
Physicians

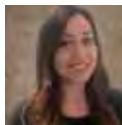
